OUR BACKGROUND

Founded in 2004, SIZA Community Care has been serving Ward 83 in Umlazi, which includes M, L, H, and a part of J sections, under the guidance of Councillor BV Mngwegwe. Originating during a period of intense HIV and AIDS prevalence, our organisation recognised a critical need for community support, especially due to the increased number of child-headed households, orphans, and vulnerable individuals struggling with poverty. Since then, we have relentlessly worked to provide assistance to more than 40,000 residents in the surrounding areas.

Over the years, our efforts have been recognised and supported by various entities. We won the Mayoral Award in Community Development in 2008 and another significant honour in UMABA for being the best organisation in Umlazi in 2018. Several organisations have collaborated with us, including the Department of Health, Department of Social Development, AIDS Health Care Foundation, AIDS Foundation of South Africa, Save the Children of South Africa, National Lottery Commission and Zoë-Life, among others.



WHAT WE DO

SIZA Community Care's mission centres on providing holistic support to the community. We identify orphans and vulnerable individuals, referring them to relevant service providers and providing necessary home-based care services. We also offer psychological support to clients, celebrate community events, provide educational support and instil life skills in unemployed youth.

Additionally, we establish income-generating projects, form support groups, supply school uniforms, and provide food parcels and cooked meals to orphans and vulnerable children. We identify victims of domestic violence, providing assistance and connections to resources. Moreover, our collaboration with several organisations extends to a wide variety of initiatives, from environment care and child rights education to support for HIV/AIDS patients and victims of gender-based violence.

WHAT WE NEED

In order to achieve our objectives and fully realise our comprehensive approach to community needs, SIZA Community Care requires additional support. Currently, we operate out of a oneroom space, which is insufficient for the scale of our projects and the number of people we serve. Therefore, a more spacious working environment is urgently needed.

Furthermore, we seek funding and partnerships for our self-sustainable programmes, which target marginalised and previously disadvantaged communities. These resources will enable us sustainably expand our reach, improve our services and empower more individuals towards a sustainable and self-reliant future.
