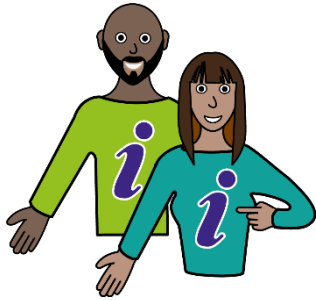
NPO means Non- Profit Organisation

Giving school uniforms to children who need them



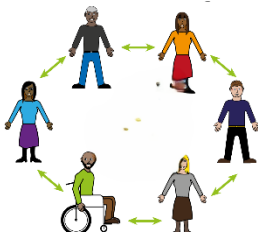
Giving food parcels and cooked meals to children

We began helping the community.
Now we support **over 40,000 people**.
